World Book Day 2021

On Thursday 4th March we celebrated the books and authors that we love for World Book Day (WBD)2021. WBD has always been a day we enjoy at Ryhall CE Academy and it was fantastic to see that during remote learning the children still embraced the day and their love of reading. Live lessons included sharing favourite stories and beloved dressing their children characters. The made puppets of story characters, filmed book recommendation blogs and wrote stories where characters from different books meet and adventure they go on. The children also completed a quiz by figuring out which teachers and TAs were hidden behind books that they love to read.





As a school, we continue to use TT Rock Stars to increase our times tables fluency. Throughout lockdown and remote learning, the children were encouraged to log onto Rock Stars as much as they could to improve their scores, collect coins and ultimately improve their times tables recall.

We are currently placed 19th in the local schools' leader board. This is a great improvement from the 25th position we held this time last year. Well done everyone. I just want to mention some very special ROCK HEROES from our Key Stage 2 classes. To become a ROCK HERO, you need to have an average speed of under 1 second per question! (That is quick!) Here are our ROCK HEROES at Ryhall:

Daniel – Tolethorpe – 0.66 seconds per question Toby – Hambleton – 0.73 seconds per question Luke – Woolsthorpe – 0.76 seconds per question Olivia – Burghley – 0.98 seconds per question



As we enter the Summer Term, children in these year groups will have the opportunity to take part in Bikeability so their new learning will be very useful. As we move closer to the end of the grace period (deadline on 30 June 2021), any EU citizen who fail to secure a successful application to the scheme, may lose the right to live in the UK and to attend our school legally. YOUR COMMUNITY

COVID SELF-TESTING KITS

You can now collect self-testing kits for use by adults of households of children at nursery, school or college or members of support bubbles – these are Lateral Flow Detection Tests (LFDT). Please note that these are for asymptomatic testing and not for children's use (unless provided by their secondary school or college for that child only). If any person is symptomatic and required to get a test, then a PCR test must be requested (either travelling to a test site or having one sent to your home). One adult from a household can collect tests from the following locations and times. There is no need to book but you must follow social distancing requirements:

- RYHALL LIBRARY: Thursday 12.30-5.00pm
- KETTON LIBRARY: Tuesday 12.30-5.00pm Each household can routinely collect two boxes of 7 tests to support testing twice weekly. Availability will be dependent on stock levels and will be at the discretion of the collection point assistant.




ACTIVE AT HOME
